


1 Manai Waterfall ()




Manai Waterfall is about 17 meters in height and is located in the middle of Takachiho Gorge. The sight of its waters crashing into the gorge is a highlight for visitors, and boats can be rented out during the day year-round to experience the falls up close from below.

4 Kihachi-no-chikaraishi Rock

A massive 200 ton stone. It is said to have been hurled by the fearsome demon, Kihachi, during a legendary battle against Mikeiri-no-Mikoto deity.

6 Columnar Joint

The layered look of Takachiho Gorge, known as columnar jointing, was created from the rapid cooling of fast-flowing lava that eroded over time into the present deep V-shaped valley.

6 Takachiho Three Bridges

One of the spots in all of Japan with a simultaneous view of three arched bridges. The three bridges showcase diverse construction technologies.

Takachiho Shrine

With a history stretching back some 1900 years, Takachiho Shrine is the most important Shinto shrine in the area and enshrines the deities of the other 88 main local shrines. Its main deities are widely worshipped as the deities for agricultural industry, warding off evil and match-making. The main Sanctuary was nationally recognized as an Important Cultural Property in 2004.



Amanoiwato Shrine

Amanoiwato Shrine is the place of Amanoiwato Mythology. This shrine has West Sanctuary and East Sanctuary, and both enshrined Sun goddess, Amaterasu-Omikami. At the West Sanctuary, you can see a rotating statue of Ame-no-Uzumeno-Mikoto. And there is a statue of Tajikarao-no-Mikoto at the parking lot of the West Sanctuary.



Amanoyasukawara

Amanoyasukawara is the cave where many deities gathered to discuss a plan to lure Amaterasu out. (15 min walk from West Sanctuary) At some point, visitores began to stack stones around the cave floor as a form of wish-making.



Kunimigaoka

At 513 meters above sea level, Kunimigaoka offers panoramic views of the area. On cool, clear and windless autumn mornings. the view may become a Sea of Clouds blanketing the landscape beneath the summit. The hilltop viewpoint has a one-star rating in the Michelin Green Guide to Japan.



Takachiho Amaterasu Railway

Takachiho Amaterasu Railway is a 30-minutes railway tour that traverses 2.55Km of disused tracks of the old Takachiho Railway. The tour highlight is the pinnacle stop atop Takachiho Iron Bridge, once the highest railway bridge in Japan. You can see some beautiful terraced rice fields.
