Kyushu **A**NatureTrail

This nature trail encompasses the entire island of Kyushu with a total length of about 2,900 km.

It connects the nature, history, and culture of the region.

The Kyushu Nature Trail is a long and magnificent trail that connects the 7 prefectures of Kyushu: Fukuoka, Saga, Nagasaki, Kumamoto, Kagoshima, Miyazaki, and Oita. The appeal of the course lies in the variety of trails that can be found along it, with both light strolls and real mountain-climbing. The course highlights the culture, history, nature, and people of Kyushu. Traveling the Nature Trail will give you thrills and experiences that cannot be found anywhere else.

Kyushu Nature Trail - Miyazaki Course

The 372-kilometer Miyazaki Course stretches from Kunimi Pass in Takachiho Town to Mt. Takachiho in Takahara Town. The full course can be covered over a long-distance journey, or you can just enjoy part of it as a day trip. The Kyushu Nature Trail has something for everyone to enjoy. Walk around, see the sights, hear the sounds, and feel the nature of Miyazaki!

Mt. Sobo in Takachiho Town

Trekking through beautiful scenery

The Sobo-katamuki National Park straddles Miyazaki and Oita prefectures.

The 5-kilometer Mt. Sobo Course (requiring about 2.5 hours) traverses the park's main peak, Mt. Sobo, and looks over the surrounding scenery including Mt. Aso and the Kuju Mountains.

he elevation of Mt. Sobo, designated as one of Japan's top 100 mountains, is 1,756 m, making it the tallest peak in Miyazaki. The Kyushu Nature Trail Sobo Course starts at the Kitadani trailhead in Takachiho Town and follows the Sengen Ridge Course, which skirts the prefectural borders between Miyazaki, Kumamoto, and Oita towards the peak of Mt. Sobo. Knowing that you will be able to look over grand. mountainous scenery from atop Mt. Sobo brings excitement to the beginning of your journey.

The start of the course is a broad trail, and feels perfect for a leisurely hike in the woods. However, the steepness of the snaking path that will appear before you through the pines may take you by surprise. The climb continues until you pass the 3rd station, where the mountain ridge appears.

Following along the ridge you will notice a pink ribbon marker at a trail that bends to the left. However, you will continue on forwards where a breathtaking view of the scenery opens up. Taking in the panorama of Mt. Aso and the Kuju Mountains will make you want to shout out across the wide open space, "Hellooo!"

Rest and take in the view at the summit. A small shrine is dedicated to Princess Toyotama, from who the name of the mountain was derived (sobo means "grandmother").

You proceed along the ridge, mindful of the

this point, the trail alternates going up, then down.

It is a leisurely stroll through secluded wooded

areas where the songs of birds float through the

air. Once you pass the 7th station, the trail which

was surrounded by trees suddenly opens again to

another magnificent view. This is Kunimi Pass.

The Fuketsu Course is another hiking route to enjoy.

You can always go back down the mountain the way you came, but the Fuketsu Course offers the opportunity of a different path back to the trailhead. Compared to the 5-kilometer Sengen Ridge course that took you to the summit, the Fuketsu Course is only 3 kilometers, but the trail is rather steep going downwards. A variety of terrain awaits you, from large rocks to climb over, mountain streams to cross, and ladders to descend throughout the course. You can enter a 20-meter deep cave for a little adventure before arriving back at the Kitadani trailhead. Next time. you can try ascending the mountain using the Fuketsu Course

An interesting point about Mt. Sobo (Sobo means "grandmother") is that it was named for Princess Toyotama, who is enshrined at a small shrine at the mountain's summit and is known as the grandmother of Japan's first emperor. Jinmu. The name is fitting, as Mivazaki is known as the birthplace of Japan in the country's ancient


